**Undergraduate: The University of South Florida  
Fort Lauderdale, Florida**

The University of South Florida offers a number of academic scholarships to freshmen planning to enter USF in the fall semester and to transfers who enroll in either the fall or spring semesters.

International students are considered for all Undergraduate Admissions scholarships. In addition, international students are also eligible to apply for many scholarships through the college/department of their major, and for non-need based scholarships through the USF Foundation Scholarship Program.

For students from eligible Latin American and the Caribbean nations (as well as Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands), USF is able to grant temporary Florida residency classification to any recipient of a state or federally funded scholarship/grant administered by USF, thus allowing the scholarship recipients from Latin America and the Caribbean the benefits of paying tuition at in-state rates. Currently, this is a savings of more than \$12,000 annually, not including the actual scholarship.

Non-need merit based scholarships are available to high achieving international students. Merit scholarships are awarded according to a student's academic performance on grades, test scores and curriculum. Scholarships range from approximately \$2,000 to over \$20,000 a year and are renewable for the entire course of study at Chapman University.

### Graduate: Duke University, The Fuqua School of Business Durham, North Carolina

Duke University's Fuqua School of Business welcomes applicants with demonstrated academic excellence, personal and professional accomplishments, proven leadership ability, and strong professional skills. The school also places a high value on candidates with diverse backgrounds and broader perspectives.

The Duke MBA Program holds three admissions application rounds from November through March. Given the competitive applicant pool, students are encouraged to apply as early in the admission cycle as possible. Each candidate is required to submit an online application form, resume, essay, official GMAT score, and TOEFL or IELTS score (if applicable), transcript, two recommendations, and an application fee.

The school strongly recommends that prospective students have a personal interview with one of the alumni or admissions fellows (second-year students selected to serve on the admissions committee). Candidates are encouraged to come to campus for an interview, but offer applicants living on the west coast of the U.S. or internationally the option to request an interview with a local alumnus. All interviews are evaluated equally regardless of location of interviewer.

### Merit-based scholarships and loans

Each year, a limited number of merit-based scholarships are available to all incoming students regardless of their citizenship. These awards are for the two-year duration of the program and range from partial to full tuition. It is important to apply in the first two rounds of admission to ensure consideration for available funds.

In addition to merit-based assistance, incoming students are eligible to apply for a combination of federal and alternative student loans to meet the cost of tuition, fees, books, and related living expenses.

Of the many alternative loan programs available, The Duke MBA Opportunity Loan is a unique program for international students that enables them to borrow up to the cost of attendance without a U.S. loan cosigner.

**Graduate: LL.M. Program in International Business & Trade Law, The John Marshall Law School  
Chicago, Illinois**

Located in downtown Chicago, The John Marshall School Law School offers more than 40 courses in international economic and trade law. Taught by some of the leading practitioners and academics in the field from Chicago, Washington, DC, New York, California, Australia and Europe, these courses provide a strong foundation for lawyers wishing to specialize in international business and trade law.

Students enrolled in the program may design curricula that meet their individual professional needs. International students may complete the 24-credit program in two semesters (with an August starting date) or may take up to two years, taking a minimum of five credits per semester. In addition to coursework, students may take advantage of a one-credit externship with a law firm or corporation, lecture series and workshops, and ready access to the Chicago legal and business communities. International students may apply for January, June or August admission, with August being the most ideal starting date.

**International Business & Trade (IBT) Externship**

After completing the 10 credit hours of LL.M. courses, students have the option of applying for an IBT Externship. The IBT Externship provides a one-credit externship in a law firm or corporation to the students enrolled in the Master of Laws Program in International and Trade Law. The IBT Externship was designed to provide an opportunity for students in the LL.M. Program to gain first-hand experience in the practice of international business and trade law.

**The Joint JD/LL.M. Degree Program in International Business and Trade Law**

John Marshall students interested in pursuing a Master of Laws degree in International Business and Trade Law may apply to become a joint JD/LL.M. candidate. Joint degree students will, in most cases, be able to complete the requirements of both programs with 104 credit hours. Joint degree students profit from taking classes with lawyers from a variety of backgrounds and practice experiences, both from the United States and overseas.

**Financial Aid**

International students are not eligible for federal student loans, but some private education loan programs may be able to assist them. **International Business & Trade (IBT) Scholarships**

Limited merit scholarship support is available to IBT applicants based on the merits of the applicant's academic and work experience. Students will be considered for merit scholarships after they have been accepted to the LL.M. Program and do not need to complete a separate application.

**The Melamed Fellowship in International Business and Trade Law**

In 2001, The John Marshall Law School initiated a fellowship program to support advanced study in the field of international business and trade law. The fellowship, was made possible through a generous gift from Leo Melamed. A 1955 graduate of The John Marshall Law School, Melamed is chairman emeritus and senior policy advisor of the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

The Melamed Fellowship in International Business and Trade Law is awarded to a full-time student in John Marshall's LL.M. Program in International Business and Trade Law. The Melamed Fellow is selected on the basis of academic merit and the potential for excellence in the field of international business and trade law.

The Fellow receives one-half tuition, a paid research assistantship in the Center for International Business and Trade Law, and a \$10,000 stipend. The Fellow is expected to complete the degree program in one calendar year. The Melamed Fellowship is currently being awarded every other year.

The Department of State and the Global SchoolNet Foundation announce the 2009 "Doors to Diplomacy" award competition, recognizing the student-created Global SchoolNet Web projects that best teach others about the importance of international affairs and diplomacy.

To qualify, middle school and high school students will work in small teams with teacher-coaches. Projects must be completed by March 15, 2009, and winners will be announced in May 2009. Every team that enters a project will receive a special "Doors to Diplomacy" certificate recognizing their achievement. Each student member of the two winning teams - one American and one international - will also receive a \$2,000 scholarship, and the winning coaches' schools will each receive a \$500 cash award.
